A giant "Thank You" to all Bazaar volunteers!



Drott Lodge members Gerry Schueman (imported foods) and Joann Moretti (imported gifts) will again be organizing Drott's sales tables at the Swedish Holiday Market 2018. They still need a few more workers. Call if you can help out for a couple hours. This is a very popular event for the Swedish community in Washington, both for the scope of items for sale and the number of people attending.

The Swedish Holiday Market 2018 is hosted by SWEA Washington DC, in conjunction with the Embassy of Sweden and House of Sweden. Tickets bought online in advance include a free Swedish fika of coffee, juice,



gingersnaps and cinnamon buns. For tickets sold at the door, the fika can be purchased for an additional charge. Non-alcoholic Glögg will also be available. Children 10 years old and under are free, but should be registered when advanced tickets are purchased. Strollers must be left outside.



This year the holiday market will be held both inside and outside House of Sweden. Indoor activities will end at 4:30 pm. They include a silent auction including Kosta with items Fjällräven, a signed Caps "Stanley Cup 2018 Winner" hockey shirt (Bäckström), a hotel weekend in Georgetown and Scandinavian holiday vendors more. including Drott will sell holiday items such as ornaments, decorations, textiles,

crystals, art, crafts, gifts, books, packaged food (cheese, herring, etc.), candy, glögg, and more. The activities outside will last until 6 pm and include lunch food, snacks and drinks for purchase, and fun activities like photos with Tomte (Santa), temporary tattoos for children, and a Volvo Truck test drive simulator. At 5pm there will be a traditional St. Lucia procession.



8 YEAR OLD GIRL DISCOVERS ANCIENT VIKING SWORD

Saga Vanecek was summering with her family at a cabin by a lake in Tanno in southern Sweden. The 8-year-old girl played in the lake on a hot day. Her father waited anxiously for a much-anticipated World Cup match to begin, imploring her to finish so he could go watch the game. But then Saga noticed something strange as she felt along the bottom of the lake, significantly shallower than normal because of Europe's sweltering summer: a long and hard object was

stuck in the lake's bed. She pulled it out of the water. Noticing a handle on one end, she pointed it toward the sky. She would later say, "'Daddy, I've found a sword!'" Indeed, she had. Museum experts estimate that the sword Saga found could be 1,500 years old.



KARIN MCCABE

Member Karin McCabe passed away on November 1, 2018 at her home in Bowie, Maryland after a one-year battle with esophageal cancer. She was 78 years old. Karin was born on March 9, 1940 in Öregrund, Sweden, to Alexius and Elly Pettersson. She graduated from the University of Stockholm with a degree in Home Economics, specializing in cooking and recipe development. Karin came to the U.S. in 1963 and worked a year for a UN Swedish diplomatic family in New York as a cook/housekeeper/entertainment assistant. She met her future husband, Tom McCabe, and worked with General Foods test kitchens in White Plains, New York. Karen and Tom moved to the Washington DC area in 1967 and to Bowie in 1969. After 10 years as a stay-at-home mom, in 1978 Karin began a 42 year career in real estate sales in the Bowie and Crofton areas. Karin loved sports of all kinds, including her father's favorite ice hockey. She was especially proud of the Washington Capitals and its star Swedish player,



Nicklas Bäckström. She loved all outdoor activities, a big Swedish tradition, including picking berries on summer trips to Sweden, swimming at her local pool with her "noodle" lady friends, walking, hiking and riding the Bowie bike trails. She loved traveling with her family to Sweden and throughout America, and spending time with her grandchildren. Karin joined Drott Lodge in 1995. She and Tom participated in many Lodge activities. For the Bazaars, Karin contributed wonderful baked goods, worked in the kitchen making sandwiches, and food on the line. granddaughters participated in many Lucia granddaughter, and her events McCabe, was our Lucia in 2015. Karen is survived in Sweden by her younger sister, Cristina Appelskog, and in the U.S. by her spouse of 52 years, Tom McCabe of Bowie, her two children. Jane Marie McCabe-

Zeender of Boulder, Colorado and Nicklas James McCabe of Arlington, Virginia, their spouses Florian Zeender and Sandi McCabe, and four grandchildren.
