DECEMBER 13th – THE SANKTA LUCIA DAY IN SWEDEN

December 13th is the Sankta Lucia Day in Sweden. This is traditionally celebrated nationwide with Lucia Processions in all schools, day-care centers, factories, offices and other work-places. Early in the morning, many high school students also celebrate as Lucia some of their teachers with song, coffee and "lussekatter", a kind of saffron buns. Even the Nobel Laureates are visited this morning in their Stockholm hotel rooms by Lucia and her attendants with song, coffee and lussekatter.

The National Lucia Procession is always shown on national TV at 7 am in the morning. Last year it was in the Cathedral of Gothenburg on the West Coast. It was a wonderful celebration with children's, women's and men's choirs singing all the traditional Lucia and Christmas songs.

DROTT LODGE AT HOUSE OF SWEDEN/SWEA HOLIDAY MARKET DECEMBER 7, 2019

The SWEA Washington D.C. Holiday Market is a popular event and will take place on December 7, 2019 at House of Sweden, 2900 K St NW, Washington, D.C. 20007.

Holiday Shoppers and Visitors will find Nordic Vendors and Artists selling their arts & crafts, including holiday ornaments, decorations, textiles, Swedish glass, gifts, books, packaged food, Glögg, candy and more!

This is by far the largest one-day event taking place at House of Sweden for the year. More than 1,500 people will attend the market during the day and watch the Lucia Procession following the market at 5 pm. Whether you want to buy someone a holiday gift or just eat Scandinavian treats – this is the Holiday Market!

In addition to all the vendors this year; Swedish FIKA & Glögg will be served, as well as Swedish ("smörgås"/"macka") sandwich with meatballs, lax, or herring.

MEMBERSHIP DUES FOR 2019

Our Membership Chair Carol Whitley informs that some Members despite reminder letters have still not made their annual dues for 2019. If you have not yet paid your 2019 dues, please mail a check to Treasurer Eva Dunhem at c/o Drott Lodge #168, 20640 Hope Spring Ter, #406, Ashburn VA 20147–2953. Dues for regular Members is \$50.00 per year. Dues for Youth Members and Drott Lodge Life Members in 2019 is \$25.75. Youth Members are those aged 14 to 24; Life Members are those who are 75 or older and who have been Members of the Lodge for 10 or more years. The reduced amount dues begins in the year following the 75th birthday. Paid membership entitles a Member to a pass on the meal fees associated with the March Pea Soup dinner and the September Welcome Back Crayfish Party. However, those Members who pay only the minimum dues required (\$25.75) are expected to pay meal fees if they attend.

The reduced amount for Youth and Life Members is equal to the amount of the assessments the Lodge must pay out annually to the Grand and District Lodges for each Member. No part of this reduced amount is retained by Drott Lodge.

Many Lodge Members choose to pay the full amount of the annual dues even if in "Life Member" status. Others add an extra amount to the required minimum dues to help support the Lodge.

In truth and unity, we hope to hear from each of you who have not paid yet for year 2019.

MEMBERSHIP DUES FOR 2020

For year 2020, Drott Lodge plans to use MemberPlanet more actively for the payment of membership dues and allow more use of credit/debit card payments. This will simplify and reduce the need for check writing by our Members. The MemberPlanet system is very well suited for credit/debit card payments. So, starting January 1, 2020, we will start using MemberPlanet to send to all Members encouragements and reminders for the membership dues for year 2020.

For year 2020, we also will encourage more and more use by our Members of the MemberPlanet system.
