Come and journey back to 10 August 1628 and discover the amazing ship Vasa, which sank in Stockholm Harbor as it departed for its maiden voyage. For those who have already toured the Vasa Museum, this will be a wonderful chance to re-visit those memories. For those who have never been to see the Vasa, you are in for a treat as you have a glimpse into one of the most popular museums in Sweden.

Drott Lodge will sponsor a virtual tour of the Royal Ship Vasa in conjunction with Vasamuset, Stockholm. Peter Rydebjörk, Assistant Director of Museum Services, will be our guide as we have a unique opportunity to tour this historic ship. The tour will last approximately one hour, with time reserved for questions and answers at the tour's conclusion.

Upcoming Drott Lodge Event May 22, 2022 Drott Lodge Spring Foraging Expedition



On Sunday, May 22nd from 3 pm - 4:30 pm, Drott Lodge will embark on a spring walk in Wheaton Regional Park* to forage for native spring edibles: mushrooms, ramps, edible flowers, and berries. Following our foraging trip, participants will meet for fika at picnic shelter #2 at the park. Those wishing to continue their day are invited to join at the fire pit for a cozy spring fire. Bring your own marshmallows to roast!

Our Spring Foraging Walk will be led by Matt Cohen of Matt's Habitats. Matt is a landscaper who became interested in foraging after spending time working on an organic farm; he hosts between 10 - 15 walks each year in the Takoma Park and Silver Spring area in search of wild edibles such as henbit, a member of the mint family, which can add a gourmet touch to a pesto.

You never know quite what you'll find underfoot once you start learning to identify the local flora. A wildflower known as the Virginia Spring Beauty yields not only mild-tasting flowers, but also has roots resembling tiny potatoes. (It's also been given the whimsical nickname of "fairy spuds.") This wildflower is rich in carbs and can be boiled like its larger namesake. "Some wild foods are really packed with vitamins and nutrients," Cohen says.

Knowing how to identify and safely —and legally— collect wild plants, fruits, and nature's other noms can net nutritional benefits and help supplement your grocery bill with fresh greens, especially this time of year when young plants boast the sweetest flavor from warm days and cool

nights.

During the walk, Cohen points out more than two dozen types of plants and trees, giving a bit of historical background on some and cooking recommendations on others.

Her excellent introduction to the classic Swedish film, "The Phantom Carriage," gave us a better understanding of this Viktor Sjöström 1921 film. Selma Lagerlöf's original novel on which the movie is based was described by Marit as a "morality tale with a Swedish twist." Indeed, the film speaks to the universality of the themes of Lagerlöf's works, and thanks to a short, biographical sketch of Lagerlöf, we could see some of the influences her life had on her work.

A discussion followed the viewing – and Marit, who has a PhD in Film History, was able to deftly field members' questions and comments. A future mini-meeting might include a viewing of another adaptation of Lagerlöf's works such as Gösta Berlings Saga.

Drott Lodge has so many talented and knowledgeable members – we are grateful when they share their expertise.

This was the second of several card-making events, so please email Janet





Fat Tuesday Bun Sampling Adventure



Most tourists visit Sweden during the summer months to take advantage of the nice weather, delicious summer foods, and all the fun outdoor activities. There are also many things to do in Sweden during the dark winter months. In the weeks leading up to Easter, Swedish bakeries go crazy producing Fat Tuesday buns (in Swedish: one semla, two semlor). Traditionally, they were sold on Tuesdays and only during Lent. That is no longer the case, as you can find them as early as January and any day of the week.

Arriving in Sweden on Feb 2, I found myself in Semla heaven! Already at the airport cafes, I could see the wonderful buns being displayed in neat rows. Being a good Swede/American Tourist, I was excited to take on the task as Drott Lodge Semla Reviewer. Most of you know the regular semla with a cardamon flavored bun, top piece cut off, bottom piece gutted and filled with almond paste filling and whipped cream, top added back on, and finally dusted with powdered sugar. Those are all good, but I set out to find some newer semlor that I had never tasted.

After four weeks of traditional semla, semla wraps, croissant semla, Wiener semla, whole wheat semla and many more, I hit the jackpot on Fat Tuesday. A day earlier, the local newspaper announced that the Ornässtugan cafe in Dalarna would be offering eleven (!) historically inspired and new semlor. Needless to say, I was there when they opened up shortly before lunch. The cafe is situated on true historic Vasa ground, the place where Gustav Eriksson (later King Gustav Vasa) was hiding out from his enemies and escaped via the outhouse! The cafe's semla selection did not disappoint. I ended up buying 4 to take home and sample: Vasa Semla, Queen Semla, Cinnamon Roll Semla and Lady of the House Semla.

After 5 weeks I was ready to crown a winner. The best semla was the Wiener Semla that I bought in Eskilstuna. No, it's not a hot dog bun. Wiener in Swedish refers to what Americans call Danish. Go figure. Anyway, the Wiener semla was light in texture, had a perfect almond paste filling and the whipped cream was very tasty. In second place was the Vasa Semla from Ornäs. It had a regular cardamon bun, walnut filling and orange flavored whipped cream. Delicious! In third place was the Queen Semla. It had a regular bun, filled with vanilla cream, Queen jam and Queen jam whipped cream. (Queen jam is a berry mix, usually blueberries and raspberries).

And for those of you that worry that too many semior is not a good idea, I did a lot of cross-country skiing in between to make sure I "earned" my next tasting.

Did you know that.....

.... the Vasa National Archives has a Genealogy Form that you can fill out to help provide a more complete picture of Scandinavian heritage in the U.S.?

The application you completed to become a Vasa member requires only a checkmark in the Ancestry portion, where one checks if his/her ancestry is one or more of the five Nordic countries and a line only on which to write other countries.

But the Genealogy Form on the Vasa Archives website (VasaArchives.org) asks for much more than that. Occupation, date entered the United States, birth places of parents and grandparents. Search "Forms" on the website.

Check it out and let's help provide the Archives with more data about Swedish immigration to the U.S.


