While studying Swedish and Psychology in Sweden in the early 80s I often ran or bicycled along fields and woods surrounding the Viking burial mounds in Uppsala. Vikings have always held a fascination for many, and the entertainment industry has capitalized on that fact. There is no shortage of dramas regarding the ruthless, savage, and brave Vikings on Netflix (my favorite is the Last Kingdom). Did you know, however, that the Vikings from what is today Sweden were mostly peaceful settlers and traders that founded the first Russian states in in what is now Russia and Ukraine? In fact, they were known as "Rus". I hope you were able to visit the Viking Festival in Manassas last Saturday, the 14th of May and learned more about who these people were, and what it was like to live during the Viking age.

As a child, my (Swedish) grandmother (Mormor) used to tell me stories about the Swedish side of my family. One such story was how during the ongoing conflict between Russia and Sweden over Finland, the Russians without prior warning raided the area where my family was living, and had to quickly hide my ancestor, a child at the time, in a haystack as the Russians advanced, later retrieving him, fleeing for their lives, and resettling to Västmanland, Sweden. We are again living in uncertain times, unfortunately, and after a period of approximately 200 years of peaceful neutrality, Sweden, like its neighbor to the East, Finland, feels threated and compelled to join a defensive alliance directed against its historical rival to the East, Russia.

Our thoughts go out to those who live in fear or persecution, and hoping for better times, and a return to peace and harmony.

On Sunday, May 22nd from 3 pm - 4:30 pm, Drott Lodge will embark on a spring walk in Wheaton Regional Park* to forage for native spring edibles: mushrooms, ramps, edible flowers, and berries. Following our foraging trip, participants will meet for fika at picnic shelter #2 at the park. Those wishing to continue their day are invited to join at the fire pit for a cozy spring fire. Bring your own marshmallows to roast!

Our Spring Foraging Walk will be led by Matt Cohen of Matt's Habitats. Matt is a landscaper who became interested in foraging after spending time working on an organic farm; he hosts between 10 - 15 walks each year in the Takoma Park and Silver Spring area in search of wild edibles such as henbit, a member of the mint family, which can add a gourmet touch to a pesto.

Please join us at 4:30 pm for fika, even if you don't go on our foraging

trip. If you are interested in a picnic supper, you may bring your own or order a boxed lunch from Panera.

Be sure to wear sturdy boots or shoes, and comfortable clothes for our walk in the woods.

Past Event Vasa Museum Virtual Tour April 22, 2022



On Saturday April 23, we were treated to a virtual tour of the Royal Ship Vasa that is located in the Vasa Museum in Stockholm. Peter Rydebjörk, Assistant Director of Museum Services, was our guide as we had a unique opportunity to tour this historic ship. Peter walked around the museum showing different views of the ship. He explained why the ship originally sank on its maiden voyage 10 August 1628, how it was raised from the bottom of Stockholm Harbor, and how they are now trying to preserve it for generations to come.

In Memoriam



Virginia Elizabeth Bergman Peters May 13, 1918 – March 27, 2022

Drott Lodge remembers longtime member Virginia Elizabeth Bergman Peters. Virginia joined our Lodge in 1983 and at almost 104 years old, she was our oldest member. Ginny was born in Minnesota, earned a BS in English, and a Masters of Arts in Anthropology. She served in WWII as a naval officer, Lt. (JG) 1943 – 1946 and then in the naval reserves from 1946 – 1951. It was in the Navy that Ginny met her husband, James Shelton Peters (Pete). Ginny had a love of history and anthropology and was an author of two books on American Indian tribes. Ginny wrote The Florida Wars in 1979 and Women of the Earth Lodges in 2000.
