Last month, Drott Lodge Chaplain Gunnel Hamilton participated in the Lidingöloppet, the world's largest cross-country race. There are several different distances to choose from each year; 30 kilometers, 15 kilometers, a mountain bike race and more. Gunnel entered the 10K for the W70 class.

The race took place on the island of Lidingö, a suburb of Stockholm. It's not on flat city streets, but a course almost entirely on cross-country trails through the small mountains (or

large hills) of Lidingö. That makes for a very demanding challenge. Once on the course, the only way home to quit is to go to the finish line.

Gunnel's husband and Drott Lodge treasurer Kenneth Hamilton participated in the Lidingöruset, a 1.7K course. He completed his race with Gunnel by his side. She must have been exhausted since she had already competed in the 10K. Kenneth's reaction after completing the 1.7K was that the decimal point was in the wrong place.

Gunnel and Kenneth are not new to this type of endurance event. They have also participated in the Vasaloppet in the past.
