National Parks of Sweden

Pictures from Fulufjället National Park

Drott Lodge's next meeting will be held on March 12 at 2:30 p.m. and will feature a presentation by member Karin Weeden entitled "National Parks of Sweden." Karin will share her recent exploration of Sweden's wonderful parks. She first went to the Haparanda Archipelago National Park in the north in

Sweden near the border of Finland. Karin also went to the largest island called Sandskär, a two-hour boat trip from the mainland. There she stayed in a cabin in the fishing village and walked the trails. Fun fact: there are moose on the island, too!

She then went to Gotland Sand **Island NP**, 40 km north of Gotland, the largest island in Sweden, located in the Baltic Sea. She took a ship to the island and stayed in a cabin on the northwest side. Smaller boats departed from the north point of Gotland Island to Gotland Sand Island. Fun fact: Gotland Sand Island does not have a harbor; each beach is an entry point where the tour boat can go up on the beach. There is no passenger transportation on the island. If you stay there, be prepared to hike up to 10 km to the campsite!

The last park Karin visited was Fulufjället (Fulu Mountain)
NP that straddles the Swedish-Norwegian border. The mountain rises in the landscape as a plateau that has steep sides and is flat on top. Most visitors come to see Sweden's tallest waterfall Njupeskär and Old Tjikko - the oldest tree in the world. Fun fact: there are no reindeer on the mountain. Each park that Karin visited was special in its own way. Come and see which one would be your favorite!







Karin was awarded the Adult Scholarship in 2020 but had to delay the trip twice due to the Covid pandemic, finally going in July of 2022 for two weeks. In addition to the national parks, she visited family members in the north (the genealogy part of the scholarship). Her presentation will include a bit about visiting second cousins on her father's side of the family.

After this long-anticipated trip, Karin will bring these beautiful parks to us through a 45-minute presentation with time for questions at the conclusion.

If you are interested in applying for the District Scholarship 2024:

The Adult scholarship is awarded to an adult member, age 21 or over, and not in school, in a local lodge in DL Pennsylvania No. 9. It is offered every two years, in an even year with the next opportunity being in 2024.

The adult scholarship should have significant educational content. It might, for example, be researching the motivations of why people of a certain area

(including relatives) emigrated; investigating the historic background and development of a region in Sweden; developing skills in genealogical research (including resources available at the VOA National Archives); learning traditional music or dances, or other topics of interest. Specifically working at the VOA National Archives for two weeks on a project is encouraged.

An important dimension in evaluating adult scholarship applications will be how the local lodge and district will benefit from the project/activity. The Adult Scholarship award will be up to \$3,000 and the receipted amount will be paid based on the Scholarship Chairman for DL PA No. 9 receiving receipts for project expenditures."

The 2024 Adult Scholarship application will be available in December, 2023. Source District Lodge website.

Swedish Crafts

Three artists will lead small group workshops on Swedish Wheat Weaving, Swedish Huck Needlework, and Dalmålning (Swedish traditional folk painting). Come and express your creativity and your Swedish heritage.

Christina Keune, a professional heritage artist since 1983, has demonstrated and lectured about rosemaling and dalmålning at numerous craft and ethnic festivals and at classes in the Washington, D. C. area, New Jersey, North Carolina and Wisconsin.

Deb Kempton, a local needlework artist and instructor will teach the classic and unique form of needle weaving known as Swedish Huck Weaving. A member and volunteer with Nelly's Needlers of Woodlawn Plantation and an avid

needle artist she brings her expertise to Drott Lodge for this event.

Mary Dix, Master Weaver of Lottsburg, VA is a well-known wheat artist brings the ancient art of wheat weaving to life. These ancient designs are historically based, from around the world, wherever long stem grains are grown. These are the patterns of life. She has lectured and demonstrated throughout the Mid-Atlantic as well as at the *Renaissance Faire*, in Maryland and Virginia.

All registered attendees will receive all the supplies to create your Swedish work of art. Some special notes: those doing Swedish Huck Weaving may want to bring a magnifying glass or "readers" for fine work. Those attendees who will be painting, may want to bring an apron or smock. And those who plan to Weave Wheat may want to bring hand lotion.

It Came to Me on a Whim

Presentation by Maria Bouroncle



Our May meeting will feature a presentation by Swedish author Maria Bouroncle. An economist by profession, she spent over 25 years in the field of international development before publishing her first novel in 2018. *It Came to Me on a Whim* has been translated into English, Dutch and Finnish, and is currently used on the Scandinavian Crime Literature course at UCLA. She lives in Washington, DC.

Maria's book tells the story of her great-aunt who killed her three children at the age of twenty-seven in 1929. Through exhaustive research, she has strived to shed light on what led up to this tragedy, which had been a tightly guarded family secret for over seventy years.

At the event, Maria will also show film director Carl Eneroth's short documentary" The Child Murderess in Vesene", based on her book. It was the winner of Best Short Documentary" in London, New Jersey and Miami in 2021.


About the Book:
